


The Gilbert Drama department will be presenting a one act play in addition to the regular spring play next weekend on April 8th and 9th. Both are comedies and one is a parody of the TV show *Law and Order* and the other is a parody of *The Hunger Games*. A large number of high school students are participating and it promises to be an evening of laughter. The show starts at 6:30 pm in the auditorium.

As many of you are aware, the Gilbert School District has earned a very strong reputation as a solid academic institution. We, like many schools in Iowa, have had a challenging time maintaining our programming when we have received less than effective state funding. Because of the increased enrollment in our district, we opened a new high school which has resulted in a variety of extra expenditures including additional staffing and building operating cost. The costs of mandated programming, three out of the last four years, have exceeded state funding increases. As a result of lower state funding and higher expenditures associated with increased enrollment, the Board of Education voted at the last meeting to bring to a budget hearing a proposal to raise the property tax by a sum of \$1.09 to 18.93 per \$1,000 valuation. In other words, for every \$100,000 of assessed valuation on a residential property, the annual assessed tax would be increased \$55.11.

The District's Administration and Board of Education will work diligently to be fiscally responsible with the money accrued from this tax. We will be bringing this matter before a budget hearing on April 11th, 2016 at 6:00 p.m.

Iowa's Top Teachers Honored

The Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching are the nation's highest honors for teachers in these content areas. Awardees serve as models for their colleagues, inspiration to their communities and leaders in improving mathematics and science education. Since 1983, more than 4,400 teachers have been recognized for their contributions in the classroom and to their profession.



Gilbert High School National Merit Scholarship Finalists

Two Gilbert High School students have been named 2016 National Merit Scholarship Finalists. Nick Day and Grant Peterson achieved the honor on the basis of their scores on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. They now have an opportunity to continue in the competition for nearly 8,000 Merit Scholarship® awards worth more than \$32 million. Finalists are the highest scoring entrants in each state and represent less than one percent of the state's seniors. Each year 2.5 million students take the qualifying test. In September, 34,000 students receive "commended" status and another 16,000 advance forward as National Merit Semi-finalists. By February, only 7,4000 students nationwide remain in the competition. Approximately half of the Finalists will be Merit Scholarship winners. These winners are chosen on the basis of their abilities, skills, and accomplishments--judged by their potential for success in rigorous college studies and beyond

Career and Technical Education Showcase

On April 1 the Story County Consortium for Career and Technical Education will be hosting a CTE Showcase at DMACC Hunziker Center in Ames. Approximately 100 students from 7 schools- Gilbert, Ames, Ballard, Collins-Maxwell, Colo-Nesco, Nevada, and Roland-Story- will be competing in Industrial Technology, Business, and Family and Consumer Sciences.

Six Gilbert HS I-Tech students will be participating in a building trades competition in which they will be given a list of materials and a tools and equipment list. They will be asked to build a small woods project that cannot exceed a specific set of size parameters. They will have approximately 30 minutes to plan and design and about 90 minutes to build the project. In addition, they will complete a measurement exercise. In the afternoon, all of the students will be visiting a job site of one of the local construction companies to observe several of the trade industries at work.

The Business Ed kids will be participating in a marketing activity in which they will be developing and organizing a local charity event for a local human service agency (the Boys and Girls Club). They will travel to the Club in the morning to meet with staff and see the facility. They will then return to DMACC and develop a fundraising plan and marketing strategy to promote the fundraiser. Their task will be to:

- 1. Organize a local charity event
 - a. Create a presentation identifying
 - i. What the event is
 - ii. Components of the event (pre-determined)
 - iii. Cost breakdown
 - iv. Advertising
 - 1. How/where
 - 2. Example poster/flyer
 - v. Target market
 - vi. Number of volunteers and supplies for each component/area of event

The Business Showcase will mix schools into groups. Gilbert High School has 5 students participating.

The Family and Consumer Sciences students will be competing in a "Chopped" Contest (similar to the TV show). There will be 18 teams competing this year. Students will be given a Box/Bag with a protein, grain, fruit, vegetable and a "Special" ingredient. There are also items for their use in the "Pantry". Students have 15 minutes to plan, 45 minutes to prepare, 15 minutes to present and then time to clean-up.

The judges this year are Nolan N. Green, Chef de Cuisine – Iowa State University Dining; Cori Albers, Chef, Lincoln Center Hy-Vee, Ames; and

Joyce Hoppes, Consumer Information, Iowa Pork Producers Association.

The Pork Council has generously donated the pork and Barilla has supplied us with whole grain pasta as well as sauce for the pantry.

Along with the Cooking Competition students will be given an objective test on Math and Measurement, have Boone HyVee Dietician Jocelyn Pohl as a guest speaker and will also take a Field Trip to Workiva (which employs more than 950 people with offices in 16 cities). The company is headquartered in Ames, Iowa.

Students will begin with a tour of the building facilities and see the Gym, Workout facility, Racquetball courts, Game room, and Atrium. They will then have the opportunity to go into the cafe area and be shown the different stations, menus, and the front of the house. Moving to the back of the kitchen they will see some of the Workiva team in action, getting ready, prepping their stations, mis en place, etc. Depending on the time they tour students may also see menu production as employees enjoy their lunches. Gilbert High School FCS will have 3 teams competing. Teams may be comprised of 2-4 members. **GOOD LUCK TIGERS!!**

Fifteen students from Gilbert's Advanced Foods class witnessed some of the best cooking done in High Schools at the 2016 Iowa ProStart Invitational on March 1 at the Iowa Events Center. The event was hosted by the Iowa Restaurant Association Education Foundation.

ProStart® is a nationwide, two-year high school program that unites the classroom and industry to develop the best and brightest talent into tomorrow's restaurant and foodservice leaders. The top winners in both the culinary and management events are crowned state champions and advance to compete at the National ProStart Invitational, April 2016 in Texas where more than \$1 Million in scholarships are awarded to the top five teams in both events.



The Culinary Competition was a Top Chef-style competition that made the students feel the heat with just 60 minutes to create a three-course meal using only two butane burners. A panel of professional industry judges judged and critiqued the students on taste, knife skills, teamwork, safety and sanitation, and much more. Thirteen schools competed in the Culinary.

The Management Competition was a Shark Tank-style competition that challenged students to create a restaurant concept from the ground up and pitch their business idea to a panel of Iowa restaurant industry professional "investors" (judges). Additionally, students had to think on their feet as a separate panel of judges fired industry-related questions at them in a Critical Thinking format.

Gilbert students thought it was very interesting and fun to watch these high school students work together as real chefs.

FCCLA NEWS



This is the second year Gilbert FCCLA and the adaptive learning class are collaborating to provide a service to high school staff- Kyra's Koffee. Adaptive learner super senior Kyra and FCCLA have started a coffee by subscription service. Kyra and friends deliver 12 oz. cups of coffee (or tea and hot chocolate) in reusable thermal cups to participants each morning during first period. Subscriptions may be daily or for specific days of the week. Refills are free throughout the morning, but staff need to visit room 114 for refills. Used cups are collected and machine washed daily at the same time that fresh cups are delivered.

The coffee is medium roast, 100% Rainforest Alliance Certified and coffee condiments are included upon request. Participants are billed twice monthly and staff are not charged when absent and their substitutes may have complimentary coffee. Coffee service is available every day during the school year with the exception of in-service days. FCCLA is excited to be working once again with Kyra (and friends) on this project!

Peaches

This month with Pick a better snack[™] students are tasting peaches or another stone fruit. Stone fruits, like peaches, plums, apricots and avocados, have a large stone or pit in the center. You probably know how delicious a fresh peach is in the summertime. This is because it is in season. When fruits and vegetables are in season they taste better and are usually less expensive.

Peaches can grow in Iowa, but aren't ready to be picked until July or August. It's fun to look forward to summer when we can eat a sweet, juicy peach. In the meantime, your money will likely go farther buying canned or frozen peaches. Look for store brands for the same product at a cheaper price.

Ideas for Eating Peaches

- Wash a fresh peach under cold running water and eat it for a yummy snack.
- Chill canned peaches for a refreshing snack or dessert.
- Sprinkle cinnamon on canned peach slices.
- Top warm oatmeal or cold cereal with diced peaches.
- Sprinkle granola on top of diced peaches.
- Add frozen peaches to smoothies.
- Cut up fresh peaches and add to a fruit salad.
- Add diced peaches to cottage cheese for a healthy snack.
- Top pancakes with diced peaches for a healthy alternative to syrup.

Peach Tips

Selecting: Choose golden colored fresh peaches with no green color or bruises. Hard peaches will typically ripen.

Storing: Place unripe fresh peaches in a paper bag at room temperature for faster ripening. Peaches are ripe when they give to gentle pressure. Refrigerate ripe peaches in a plastic bag for up to 5 days. Store unopened cans of peaches at room temperature. Once the can is opened, the remaining peaches should be stored in a tightly covered container (not in the can) and refrigerated.

Buying: A great price for fresh peaches is \$.99 per pound (about 3 medium peaches). When buying canned peaches, select peaches packed in 100% juice. If buying frozen, look for "unsweetened". Single-serve containers are convenient, but are usually more expensive. Compare brands of fruit cups for the best price.
